

NEBOSH National Certificate in Construction Health & Safety for holders of the General Certificate Level 3

Course Details

The NEBOSH National Construction Certificate is a qualification both for those with construction management responsibilities and for those who are required to provide routine day-to-day advice on health, safety and welfare in construction work. The course is designed to enable holders of the National General Certificate who have passed the qualification in the last five years to complete the NEBOSH National Construction Certificate.

The course therefore contains the additional units that are required to enable the student to complete the NEBOSH National Construction Certificate.

The syllabus comprises 12 units:

- 1 Construction law and management.
- 2 General site issues – hazards and control.
- 3 Working at height - hazards and control.
- 4 Excavation work and confined spaces.
- 5 Demolition hazards and control.
- 6 Movement of people and vehicles – hazards and control.
- 7 Work equipment hazards and control.
- 8 Manual and mechanical handling hazards and control.
- 9 Electrical hazards and control.
- 10 Fire hazards and control.
- 11 Chemical and biological health hazards and control.
- 12 Physical and psychological health hazards and control.

Entry Requirements

NEBOSH National General Certificate in the last five years.

Assessment

NEBOSH external examination to include:

- 1 Practical assessment and written report (2 hours) (NCC2).
- 2 Controlling construction workplace hazards (2 hours) (NCC1).

Learning Outcome

This course prepares students for the examination of The National Examination Board in Occupational Safety & Health (NEBOSH).

Progression after Programme

National Diploma of Occupational Safety & Health.

Students should be fully conversant with:

Material covered in the Health & Safety Executive booklets Essentials of Health & Safety at Work, and Human Factors in Industrial Safety, both published by HMSO; Principles of Health and Safety at Work - IOSH Publication.

The main items of legislation, as outlined in the new syllabus, that apply generally to workplaces. (New legislation will not be examinable until six months notice has been given. Notices will be made in the Board's Certificate Bulletin and also in the IOSH journal The Safety and Health Practitioner.)

NEBOSH - The National Examination Board in Occupational Safety and Health is an independent examining body which was founded in 1979, and has established itself as the authoritative national examining body in occupational safety and health. The current system of vocational qualifications has been developed to meet the safety and health training needs of industry, commerce, and public services in the 1990s.
